## SHADOE ( female – feral ) -is available for adoption

On Friday, March 17, 2017 this young black cat was observed in the Cedarpines Park, CA – Breezy Point area. She definitely appeared to be scared and is unapproachable by humans.

On Saturday, March 18, 2017, about 8:00 PM this little kitty appeared on my front deck. I provided food and water. Again, she was scared and unapproachable.



On Sunday, March 19, 2017, about 11:45 AM this little kitty, again appeared on my front deck. I provided food and water. Again, she was scared and unapproachable.



On Tuesday, March 21, 2017 we were able to safely trap the young kitty using the Havahart® Large 1-Door Animal Trap - Model #: 1079-B. We caught her just before the mountain storms of rain and slush hit the area. Otherwise, most certainly she would not have survived in the cold and wet weather.

On Friday, March 24, 2017 this young kitty – SHADOE – passed her Wellness Check at the Rimforest Animal Hospital. She was a bit dehydrated and was treated for that as well as passing her FELEUK/FIV tests and receiving her 1<sup>st</sup> series of vaccinations.

SHADOE is very scared and unapproachable. She hisses and growls and retreats. So frustrating for all. ☹

SHADOE is currently residing in Cedarpines Park in a 3ft wide, 2ft deep, 4ft high cage. She is safe and warm inside and isolated in a separate room in the house away from the 3 resident Kitty ( grown adult ) boys.



This is NOT the ideal environment for SHADOE to live in a small cage. We have a small cabin and cannot dedicate a room to isolate and socialize her.

PLEASE consider that SHADOE will require patience in her handling and domestication.
